# Levels of Dialogue Facilitation

## 1. Basic level

**Members are trained to apply Dialogue Facilitating to their target groups**

**They attend in 1 (one) Quality Enhancement Workshop of ENDF per year and receive the proof of participation.**

**They document their dialogue sessions in a written way for self-reflection and exchange.**





# Levels of Dialogue Facilitation

## 2. Advanced level

**Members are trained to apply Dialogue Facilitating to different target groups in various fields of dialogical practice.**

**They attend a 3day Quality Enhancement Workshop per year and document 10 dialogue sessions in a written way for self-reflection and exchange.**

**These documentations are basis for an exchange of advanced Dialogue Facilitators during the workshops.**



## Levels of Dialogue Facilitation

### 3. Professional level

Members step from the *advanced level* and are trained in a 1 week further education to “Train the Trainers for Dialogue Facilitating”. They can get the ToT permission if they fulfil the agreed quality standards of Trainers for Dialogue Facilitators (TDiaF).

They join the circle of trainers (3 days) once a year for a professional exchange of experiences in the field of didactics and methodological approaches as well as about theoretical and research aspects.
